# 2017-2018 OLIVER AMES

Youth Health Survey Results

The 2017-2018 Oliver Ames Youth Health Survey was conducted on February 15, 2018. Procedures and results from 958 valid surveys are included in this report.

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#### Survey Design

The 2017-2018 Oliver Ames Youth Health Survey was adapted from the 2017 National Youth Risk Behavior Survey and the 2015 Oliver Ames Adolescent Wellness Survey.

Questions and multiple choice answers are available verbatim within each frequency table in Appendices A, B, and C.

#### Survey Administration

The survey was administered on February 15, 2018 on paper forms with multiple choice selection bubbles embedded within each question. Students took the survey during their advisory period.

#### Data Cleaning

Results were mailed to Scantron for processing and emailed to the evaluator. In total, there were 1,014 surveys responses returned to the evaluator. The data underwent a three step validity process to remove surveys that showed a pattern of illogical and inconsistent answers. Surveys that were removed at each step of the process are in parentheses.

- 1. Respondents who answered "no" to the question "Were you honest when taking this survey?" (46 surveys)
- 2. Respondents who answered a question that asked if they have used a drug that does not exist. (10 surveys)
- 3. Respondents who displayed a pattern of inconsistency and exaggeration. (0 surveys)

The final sample included 958 valid surveys.

### Data Analysis

Each question was analyzed by creating frequency tables that include a count of respondents that selected each available answer. The majority of questions were multiple choice in which respondents could select only one answer. The percentages underneath the count for these questions represent the number of respondents that selected each answer out of all respondents that answered that question.

For the questions that offered for respondents to select all answers that apply, the frequencies are calculated by dividing the number of respondents that selected each answer by the total number of valid respondents.

Logical edits are made when two answers by the same student are contradictory. One example of a logical edit would be, if a student responded that they had never smoked cigarettes, but indicated they had smoked cigarettes in the past 30 days. In these cases, both answers are removed and the remainder of the survey is kept intact. If the student contradicted themselves three or more times, the entire survey would be removed. No students were removed from this sample for that reason.

Additionally, cross-tabulations were conducted for each question by gender and grade (Appendices B and C). The frequencies in these tables are the percentage that selected each response of the total number of respondents in each sex or grade category.

#### Year over year comparison

As state and national data is not yet available for the 2017 Youth Risk Behavior Survey, comparisons will be made with the 2015 Oliver Ames Adolescent Wellness Survey, which surveyed Oliver Ames students on December 22, 2015. It is important to note one key difference between the 2015 survey and the 2017 survey. The 2017 survey included additional data cleaning techniques which included asking about a drug that does not exist. This is likely to have removed additional invalid surveys.

Respondents were asked if they had participated in bullying a peer in the past year. While only 3.1% answered yes, 8.9% indicated they were unsure if they had participated in bullying a peer.

Additionally, 3.6% of respondents indicated that bullying had prevented them from attending school in the past year.

In addition to personal safety behaviors, respondents were asked about the behavior of drivers of the cars they had been riding in in the past 30 days. Of all respondents, 13.4% had been in a car where the driver had been drinking alcohol, 8.2% had been in a car where the driver had been using marijuana, and 58.1% had been in a car where the driver was texting.

While 53.5% of respondents indicated that they had never engaged in "sexting" (the sending of sexual messages or images by cell phone), 28.7% of respondents said they have received inappropriate messages or pictures and 22% said they have initiated inappropriate messages or pictures.






# PERCEPTIONS





When asked if respondents preferred to hang out with people who do not drink alcohol or use marijuana, 54.4% and 55.9% answered yes, respectively.

When asked if respondents preferred parties where people do not drink alcohol or use marijuana, 51.3% and 62.0% answered yes, respectively.



While only 3.3% of surveys were removed for suspected dishonesty, 54.5% of students had the perception that the average student was not honest on this survey.
